

Saint-Saturnin Presentation

About twenty kilometers south of Clermont-Ferrand, between the Monne gorges and the Veyre valley, Saint-Saturnin, brings together in the same place, one of the 5 major churches of Auvergne Romanesque art and a imposing Royal Castle which hosted Catherine de Medici and Charles IX.

Alongside this "high" heritage, coexist: washhouses, beautiful peasant houses, Medieval fountain, dovecotes...



The village is located in the central area of Puy de Dôme, between the two main cities of Clermont and Issoire and with direct access to the free A75 motorway. Access time by car: 12 minutes from the south of Clermont and Issoire, 4 hours from Paris, 2 hours from Lyon.



Also note the strategic position between the agglomeration of Clermont, the Gergovie site and the entire tourist area of Sancy with Aydat, Murol, Saint Nectaire, Besse and Mont Dore.

Saint-Saturnin also benefits from an exceptional natural heritage. Nestled on a lava flow, the entire area has been classified as a "UNESCO World Heritage Site".

It therefore enjoys a reputation and significant landscape protection.
